

### Nov 29: Chapel Service UUSC *Guest At Your Table* The Meaning of Home



For many of us, our relationship with home has intensified this year. The pandemic has given many of us new appreciation for, and concerns about, the places we call home and the centrality of these places in our lives.

This year during Guest at Your Table, we invite you to witness stories of our partners around the world as they tell you about home. Our partners in Central America are working to make sure no one is forced to flee their home due to violence or economic devastation. Our partners in Alaska, Louisiana, and the Pacific are fighting for their homes and ancestral lands against the ravages of extractive industries and climate change. And our partners in Burma, Bangladesh, and beyond are working tirelessly to support the rights of the Rohingya ethnic minority of Burma after facing government backed genocide in their homeland.

#### THE PURPOSE OF OUR ENDOWMENT

Since 1874 church members have been contributing to an endowment for the benefit of our church. For many years the Trust Funds were used to supplement the operating budget, but in 2005 the congregation adopted a policy that disallows the use of the funds for an ordinary budget shortfall. Rather, the funds are to be used for special projects or opportunities that further our mission, for "major capital expenditures and significant improvement projects related to the church's buildings and real property", and to help manage emergency cash flow needs.

Gifts of any size are welcome additions to the Endowment. They can be made at any time or as a bequest in your will. Language for either a direct donation or a bequest is now available in a brochure that the Trustees have produced. Thank you for supporting the UU Church of Wakefield!

The Wakefield Food Pantry is hosting an online auction November 15th - 22nd at <a href="http://www.charityauction.bid/wakefieldfoodpantry">http://www.charityauction.bid/wakefieldfoodpantry</a>. This website explains how an online auction works and even has a video demonstrating how to register as a bidder. For those serious bidders among us, they offer a mobile bidding app that will notify you when you are outbid on an item. And for those who prefer proxy bidding, you are able to enter your highest bid on an item, sit back, and watch the bidding commence.

The food pantry has seen a 30% increase in the number of households visiting the pantry since the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic. Last year, over 800 households visited the pantry, taking home an average of 4 bags of groceries per visit. This adds up to 24,512 bags given out in the last year. The increase in food insecurity is affecting our neighbors in Wakefield. While donations of food to the pantry are appreciated, monetary donations are more valuable. For each dollar donated, the Food Pantry is able to buy four dollars worth of food from the Boston Food Bank. So, if you are able, please consider either donating to the Food Pantry directly or participating in their online auction. More information is available at https:// wakefieldfoodpantry.org/
